Holiday Food Drive



This presentation focused on being proactive and preventative, using evidenced-based practices, and operating from a strengths-based approach to improve how we work with students as well as their families.

Our second quarter Lunch and Learn event was hosted by Amy Farmer, provided an in-depth look at our Broad-Based Educational Services and Therapies, or BEST Model programming. This particular classroom model is ideal for students with significant autism or developmental disabilities. We utilize ABA approaches to improve language-based social and leisure skills, build fine motor skills, reduce maladaptive behaviors, and work to generalize these skills in real-world situations.
