# **MEETING MINUTES**

Ms. Vega opens the event and welcomes parents to Excel Southwest FAFSA Night.

Jazzmine Howlette the College and Career Coach introduced herself.

Ms. Vega begins addressing the purpose of the evening. FAFSA is a Free Application for Federal Student Aid. FAFSA opened in December, but no dates were given. FAFSA determines how much federal aid is given to a student based on household income. For today's meeting we will focus on creating the students' FASFA ID. Once their ID is created a email will be sent to your students inviting you to complete your FASFA ID. We will follow along with PowerPoint.

Ms. Vega pulls up the FAFSA "how to" guide.

Ms. Vega points to the website that parents and students should be on. Once you are on the FAFSA website, go ahead and create an account. When you create that account as a parent, or a student make sure that you remember your log in information.

Ms. Vega addresses some of the common questions asked as a whole group:

- FAFSA will ask for personal information such as SSN.
- FAFSA needs to be completed with the support of parents and tax information is needed.
- If you created an account and it states that your SSN needs to be verified, this is something common. We will need to wait 2-3 days for FAFSA to verify the information. You will get an email.





- FAFSA will have you create a PIN, please ensure that you have that information.

Ms. Figueroa had a problem with login in due to forget the login information for AO. So, the parents have to contact FASFA to reset the account.

Ms. Vega begins the closing statement. While we were not able to complete the application, we were able to get started and we all have an account. We are all in different places and that is okay. Keep an eye out on your email and we will reconvene to complete the application in December. You can complete it on your own but if you have questions feel free to call the school.

Ms. Howlette and I will still be here for the next 15 minutes if you have any specific questions on the application.
