Topics Covered Included:

Lifestyle Preferences

Families learned how to define and document the lifestyle preferences of their loved ones to ensure their personal values, daily routines, and community connections are respected in the future.

Potential Legal Issues

Attendees were informed about key legal considerations that can arise in special needs planning, from decision-making authority to estate planning complexities.

Financial Security

Meridian provided strategies for building long-term financial security, including how to manage assets without jeopardizing eligibility for public benefits.

Letter of Intent

This important, non-legal document helps guide future caregivers by outlining personal, medical, and educational information specific to the child's needs and preferences

The night concluded with a Q&A session, allowing families to ask personalized questions and gain further clarity on how to take the next steps in their planning journey.
